Oh They're fair, propulsive, smart, surprising, and infinitely human GWM: You have been an award-winning investigative years. How has that background helped your writing? Ryan: It's the best possible
training! I've learned a good
story calls for a charactor story calls for a character you care about, a high-stakes solved, where the good guys win, and the bad guys get what's coming to them. And in the end theres justice and the world is changed.
That's the key to a terrific investigative story, and to a killer novel as well. It's just that in writing crime fiction, I had to learn to make stuff up. I've also doesn't have to be perfect on the first draft.
GWM: What is the most diffi cult part of writing fiction? Ryan: Two parts. One is coming up with the initial gorgeous gem of an idea. And
